Superintendent Report: Superintendent, Brady Stagner reported:
In several Superintendent meetings they discussed the BEST Health Insurance premiums. They are talking about an increase of 15%. They are also High deductible plans and HRA's.
Mr. Sinclair has asked about purchasing a Pick Up Truck for the AG Department. This will aid in the moving of livestock and equipment. CTE will kick in some of the funds and the price would be around 30K. They are looking to get the best deal. We are having issues with the removable wall in the gym due to COVID and having to open and close for the different events. The price to replace/repair is around 23K. This will be a summertime project. We have had the bleachers and all around the gym inspected with no issues. We are still having problems with heat pumps #5 and #3. We had our Fire Inspection and he was very thorough. We have 4 pages of small issues that will need to be fixed and he will come back. One issue was that we do not have our address posted in the front of the building. The Ag Department will create the numbers and we will have them mounted in the front entrance. Mr. Stagner informed the board of Barb Grandell's resignation. She has requested to do the 140 day additional year. This will be up to the new superintendent. Mr. Stagner also mentioned that NHS video recorded the Homecoming court this year. There was also an issue of the ineligible list going out in error instead of the Sangre weekly. We tried to remedy this situation as quickly as possible. There was some discussion as to having the graduation outside or inside. The outside option allows for more to attend.
