Generative artificial intelligence is capable of generating text, images, or other data using large language models or artificial neural networks, often in response to prompts. Two platforms that are of specific concern are chatgpt and photomath. Chatgpt allows prompts to be submitted to it, and the ai provides responses that can be used as plagiarism on any school-related work and tests. Photomath allows users to take pictures of math problems and it will provide steps to solve and the answer. Various prompts were presented as well as various math problems. The impact of generative AI was discussed. Ethical use of generative artificial intelligence was presented, this mainly focused on [schoolai.com](http://schoolai.com) - a free-to-educators AI website that allows the creation of AI prompts used to guide students rather than to cheat. It provides real-time monitoring, tracking student responses, and feedback on where students may need support. A possible district policy and student handbook updates were presented for the board to consider adopting. The ethical use of generative artificial intelligence would be promoted through the presented policy additions.
